- 1. Relaxation: breathing, relaxation response, guided imagery, cognitive reframing,
- 2. Movement: mind-body movement, stretches, repositioning, progressive muscle relaxation
- 3. Presence: Deep listening, light touch & massage, therapeutic presence
- 4. Sensory: Reflection, sensory forms of distraction

A. Application in Practice

### **Learning Outcomes:**

- Participants will reflect upon and share common pain management challenges (and successes) they experience in their clinical practice setting.

- Participants will create and share their individualized plan for bringing the skills they have learned into their practice.

B. Simulation of IAPM

<u>Learning Outcome</u>: Participants will apply IAPM skills they have learned in the practice workshop into simulated patient care scenarios. Participants will participate in a debriefing with the simulation facilitator after each scenario.
